If you are a family who live outside our school zone, you need to have any sibling enrolment forms in for all of 2024 so that you are included in our out of zone enrolment processes.

Teachers are not expected in classes until 8.30am as they spend time prior to this planning for the day ahead. If your child needs to come to school earlier than 8.30am we have the onsite provision of YMCA before school care which we encourage you to make the
