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Message from the Principal

Kia ora e te whānau

Meet the teacher—thanks and feedback welcome!

Thanks to all those who met with their child's teacher last week via Google Meet. Thank you also for being so understanding as we moved to online meetings. We know this isn't quite the same however with the current rise of Omicron cases, felt it the most prudent cause of action. I know some made alternative arrangements to catch up with the child's teacher online on a different day. It's not too late to meet—contact your child's teacher to make a time that suits you both. These meetings are a starting point to us working towards our strategic goal of *expanding and strengthening connections* and we will be using the information we learnt about your child and whānau as the year progresses.

Staying safe with Covid-19

As covid cases increase in our community, we will inevitably have increasing numbers of children and staff isolating at home. It is important that everyone in our school community follows Ministry of Health guidelines in terms of what to do if you are a close contact to a positive case. We are working on our learning from home activities and will share these with students who need to isolate on a case by case basis.

To support us in preparing for the possibility of learning from home, we need all families to:

- 1. Email Phillipa at principal@pinehaven.school.nz by Wednesday 2nd March if your child will not have access to a device to support learning at home (there may be some support that we can access/offer for these children).
- 2. Ensure the office has up to date contacts for you if these have changed. Email Pamela at office@pinehaven.school.nz
- 3. Email Phillipa at principal@pinehaven.school.nz if you will be in a situation where all adults in your household are critical workers (if we get to a point of having to reduce numbers of children learning on site, we need to know who you are).

Digital Technology—Being ready for online learning

It might be worth checking your internet speed at a website such as <u>https://www.wirelessnation.co.nz/speed-test/</u>. A good internet speed is anywhere between 50 and 100 Mbps. Speeds of 50 to 100 Mbps allow a few people to stream in HD or even 4K, stream music, game, browse social media, and work from home. If you find your devices freezing or taking a long time to load video it might be worth a check in with your internet provider to see if you can get a modem/router upgrade.

Concerns

Firstly, thank you for the positive comments which have come our way related to the hard mahi our staff are doing to engage our students at Pinehaven School. As mentioned above, these are difficult times to manage however our staff are committed to doing their best for our children each and every day. I want to thank them for their continued efforts and dedication.

At times however, a concern is raised with us. I thought it timely to share our processes regarding concerns and complaints. In the first instance, it is best to contact your child's classroom teacher. Issues can often be resolved via email or a phone call However, if you have a concern which requires more investigation after speaking to the teacher, contact the Hub Leader then Leadership Team.
