## Background to the Learning Support Co-Ordinator (LSC) role:

Schools across the Upper Hutt Cluster are fortunate to have an additional trained teacher working in their school settings. Vi Lyons is the Learning Support Co-Ordinator here at Pinehaven School. ## Purpose of the role:

The purpose of the LSC role is to ensure children and young people with additional learning needs have access to the services and support they need. They will substantively contribute to a collaborative approach that organizes learning support around what best meets the needs of children and young people across our cluster. They will help simplify the current learning support system, particularly for key stakeholders that interact with it, including parents
